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Cover Photo

Since I take as many as 150 or even 200 photos per weekend when we have Diablo or PCA activities, selecting one for a cover is typically difficult. I am inclined toward images from my Olympus not so much as an ego thing, but because I anticipate cover shots and often set the camera for the best quality to get $10 \pm MB$ originals. I carry 1 GB of camera memory so I am never forced to shoot at lower resolutions to conserve storage space.

When I have used cover images from members who shoot at typical resolutions, the our excellent printing and glossy paper is such that my eye can see the lower quality. This cover was originally 32 x 24 inches in size and 11.2 MBs as a 72 dpi IPEG. I then converted it to a 300 dpi TIFF for quality printing, but did so after extensive cropping and resizing. Without the smaller size and cropping, it would have been a 192 MB monstrosity. In the current configuration on the cover, it is a 8 MB 300 dpi TIFF. (f/3.5, ISO 50 and 47.8 mm focal length) It was taken at the Saturday, 6/19, Indy SuperCup race and was hand-held using the 10x zoom.

own horn" struggle with an urge to celebrate the second anniversary of one of my most cherished Porsche moments. It shows the "S" coming down the esses toward a first place trophy at the 2002 Porsche Parade in Boise. In addition, beating the state trooper chief instructor's Crown Vic by a full 15 seconds in one lap was almost as delightful as Peter Porsche's autograph on the trophy. My hope is that each one of you readers has some similarly happy recollection to add spring to your step.

"Life is too short to spend time going in circles" is a thought that frquently comes to mind when I think about the Indy 500 or IRL racing. F1 and Porsche SuperCup are, however, very different, and I found myself getting up close and personal (blisters on both feet from trudging back and forth within the 2½ mile track is a little too personal for me) within the hallowed brickyard.

The Porsche people who drive across many states to see an F1 race and attend a PCA Porsche Supercup dinner are exceptional, and meeting them was one of the weekend's highlights. I also enjoyed speaking with Patrick Long (see Popourri on page 4) and hearing how very different and difficult it is to switch between Cup and the RSR endurance Porsches.

Seeing the 35,000 sq. ft. Walker Racing shop was interesting, but Derrick Walker's warm and friendly explanation of Porsche's Indy 500 ups and downs was a real eye opener to the behind the scene tribulations of being subject to an unfriendly sanctioning body. Both Walker and Kevin Buckler semed at ease and patient with our questions in spite of each of them leaving the dinner early to fly back to their respective opposite coast racing on Sunday. I found the F1 crowd to be most interesting especially since so many of them were not from the States. I had stimulating conversations with people from Canada, Germany, Brazil, Columbia and France.

Taking pictues was a real challenge. I was either finding an opening in the fencing or getting high enough in the stands to shoot over the fencing. In the former case, all the regular pros staked-out their spots very early and being high in the stands was much too far away. I did, however, have some great photographer exchanges of information plus friendly sharing of key spots. I found one great spot on my own although it did require sort of blocking a stairway and hanging out over the track a tiny bit.

Overall, the best part was hanging out for several hours at Starbucks in the airport. Almost every F1 crew stopped in. The group that stayed the longest, however, was also the most interesting. They were a private enterprize film and broadcast crew that mostly interviewed the drivers and sent out out PR type videos throughout the world for the respective sponsors. Hans Stuck was not there but he worked for their German language projects. I had been dying to hear the inside scoop on Hans's departure from Porsche to his current driving chores with BMW. Since Hans now routinely speaks derisively of Porsche, I knew that the details would be juicy and they were.

These folks worked most with Juan Pablo Montoya and seemed clear that his departure from Williams was not closely related to his car control skills.

By contrast, this crew said that, in spite of the media working hard to make Michael a villian, he remains a charming, warm hearted regular guy who devotes much of his time and energy to his young family. There was concensus that Michael was an exceptional human being.

With all the excellent experiences at Indy, I doubt that I will go back again. The locals are fine people but the corporate trippling of hotel/motel rates far out into the outskirts really turned me off. It is also, in spite of many jumbo TV stands, very hard to see the racing, and there was no opportunity whatever to get near the garage area.

On the surface (below), it looks like a whole bunch of people being friendly and helpful, but an obligatory inspection following a spin on the track puts it into a different light.



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
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

49th Annual Porsche Parade
