Diablo Needs You!!

Our region has nearly 600 regular members, over 1,000 including affiliate members, but a mere handful of these members have been involved in putting on events and running the region. If we want Diablo to thrive and be able to put on the types of events all of us can enjoy, this has to change.

The good news is, each of us can make a difference! We have opportunities for people to get involved and contribute at all levels of the club, and at all levels of time commitment. From board members to ticket takers, from registrars to graphic artists, we need your unique talents to make Diablo more enjoyable and rewarding.

All of the positions listed are appointed by the Board of Directors for one calendar year, except where otherwise stated. However non-Board positions can be renewed for as long as the member wishes and the Board agrees.

To apply for one of these positions, send email to <u>president@diablo-pca.org</u> and include a few sentences about why you think you'd be right for the position.

Member-At-Large, Board of Directors

A Member-At-Large of the Board of Directors volunteers for or is assigned various duties by the Board of Directors. They attend monthly meetings to conduct the region's business, and collaborate with the rest of the Board between meetings. This is a leadership position and so requires a significant time commitment. At-Large members may also hold other positions as described below.

The available term runs through the end of 2009.

Secretary, Board of Directors

The club's Secretary is a member of the Board of Directors. In addition to those duties, the Secretary is responsible for compiling and publishing minutes of meetings of the Board, organizing all official Diablo correspondence, and managing the annual elections. This is a leadership position and an officer of the corporation, and so requires a significant time commitment.

The available term runs through the end of 2008.

Assistant Secretary

This person will assist the Secretary in carrying out their duties as described above. In the event the Secretary is absent from Board meetings, the Assistant Secretary will represent them in the meeting.

Membership Chair

The Membership Chair is responsible for handling inquiries from the public and potential new members of the club, sending "welcome" packets to new members, and coordinating member retention efforts as directed by the Board. The Membership Chair is often the most familiar person in the club to new members, follows up with members who fail to renew, and recognizes significant member anniversaries.

Diablo Needs You!! (continued)

Assistant Membership Chair

This person will assist the Membership Chair in carrying out their duties as described above. They may present the monthly membership report to the Board when the Chair is unable to do so, and be assigned other duties. For example, an Assistant Membership Chair could be responsible for organizing special activities to welcome new members into the club during their first 12 to 24 months.

Assistant Newsletter Editor

The Newsletter Editor is responsible for publishing The Devil's Advocate each month. This includes desktop publishing tasks, working with members to obtain pictures and write-ups about region events, or writing stories of interest to our members. The Assistant Editor is expected to work closely with the rest of the Advocate team, the Advertising Manager, and the Webmaster's team.

Assistant Events Chair

The Events Chair is responsible for planning the Diablo event calendar, supporting the coordinators of individual events, and coordinating the larger region events such as the Annual Dinner or Holiday Party. Assistant Events Chairs may focus on one of these areas, or share the overall workload with the Chair and other Assistants.

Assistant Track Chair, or Track Co-Chair

The Track Chair is responsible for determining the schedule of track events for the year, making arrangements with venues, interacting with vendors, organizing volunteers and instructors, etc. There are many, many tasks that go into making a track event happen, and there is an opportunity here for one or more members to learn how it all works. Time commitment and duties will determine whether the member is an Assistant or Co-Chair, with an opportunity for advancement if so desired.

Goodie Store Manager

The region offers certain Porsche, PCA, and Diablo-branded merchandise for sale; this operation is generally referred to as The Goodie Store. The Manager is responsible for making sure these goods are available for purchase at Diablo events, maintaining inventory, proposing new products, and reporting Store activity to the Board. There is a great opportunity for creative merchandising here...

Registrar

When Diablo holds larger events, the Registrar will accept applications and checks from members, compile a roster for people checking in at the start of the event, determine if anybody is due a refund, and otherwise assist with the smooth operation of these events.

Event Staff

We need a number of members willing to work registration, staff rally checkpoints, and otherwise help out when the region puts on events. A willingness to pitch in and help is the most important qualification for this position.

Diablo Needs You!! (Continued)

Webmaster

The Diablo web site should be a focus of information and activity for all members of the region. Somebody with experience in web site design and operations is required to lead a team that will redesign and maintain the Diablo site. The Webmaster will work at the general direction of the Board, but their team will have the opportunity for considerable creative expression.

Assistant Webmaster

Work as part of a team charged with making the Diablo web site a central part of the region's online life. This position helps the Webmaster fulfill their responsibilities as described above.

Graphic Designer

Our region needs artwork of various kinds to promote events, use on the web site and newsletter, and to produce region merchandise and apparel. This position is a great opportunity for a creative individual to build up a portfolio of exciting professional work while helping the club. This person would work with various chairs and teams as needed, and might be part of a team

I blame my father. OK, to be fair, perhaps it wasn't totally his fault. But, that's where it started. I just returned from our Drivers Education (DE) event at Thunderhill Raceway Park outside of Willows, just south of Chico. This was my fourth such event since buying a 2005 997 and these days continue to deliver on the promise my father must have been given in 1974. To experience all that a Porsche is, you must drive it at speed. There is no safer, no more educational and for my money, no better way to have that experience than on a racetrack in the company of your fellow PCA club members.

In 1974, my father worked at Edwards Air Force Base in the heart of the Mojave Desert and we lived in Lancaster, CA. For you racers, think Willow Springs in Rosamond and for the rest of you, think of, well, miles of open desert roads through seas of orange poppies and forests of green Yuccas. As a native of New York City, my father developed a thing for cars after coming west and contacted a family friend who owned an early 911. Several months later a shiny Blood Orange (not sure of the correct Porsche color name) 1972 914 1.7 appeared in the driveway. As a 10 year old, it was all I could do not to sleep in that fabulous cool car!

Fast forward to today and, well, you can start to see why I blame my father. At least that's what I told my wife when I bought my car and when I signed up for Drivers Education and when I now buy parts for the car and when I wash it before an event and.....

Typically, everyone who attends a DE day as a driver is assigned a run group and depending on the number of attendees, 4 or 5 run groups are arranged. The groups run back to back throughout the day and you usually drive 20 - 25 minute on track sessions 4 or 5 times during the day with a highly experienced instructor (for beginners) guiding you around every corner. That means you typically have about and hour and a half to 2 hours of track time

Yesterday was an a typical day though. Warren Gardner and the terrific Diablo team organized a special training opportunity for Diablo instructors with the Head of Instruction from PCA National. Since the day involved lots of class-room time mixed with on track time for the instructors and mentors, those of us lucky enough to brave a cold but beautifully dry January day were treated to ideal track conditions and more track time than normal. Ok, that's an understatement. About 20 Intermediate and Advanced drivers were put into one run group and other than the instructors and mentors we basically had the track to ourselves. Yup. 4 hours and 15 minutes of scheduled track time.

Have you ever been to Disneyland when there were no lines? How about your favorite golf course when you didn't see another soul? Can you imagine a sale at Nordstrom where you are the only one of the floor other than employees? You get the point. It was exciting, overwhelming, a special treat and I just didn't want it to end.

If you have the chance to join us on any upcoming DE days, know this. Your pace is up to you. You go only as fast as you feel comfortable. No one keeps score. Everyone has fun. Because the rules are built for your safety and the instruction is there to support you, you just can't miss the chance to improve your skills and confidence and experience these cars the way they were meant to be driven.

I called my Dad on the way home and I thanked him. Over and over.



Diablo Region Annual Photo Tour Contest

Rules for 2008, v1.0

Summary

The annual photo tour is a contest where members submit photos of themselves and/or their cars in various cities and towns within the state of California. One photo should be submitted for each letter of the alphabet, taken in a city, town or village whose first name begins with that letter. Each photo must show the name of the town on a municipal building (see rules for details). The winner may keep the annual trophy for the rest of the calendar year in which they receive it.

Contest Rules

1. Photographs

Photographs must meet the following criteria.

- 1.1. Subject: Contestant or their Porsche vehicle must appear in each photograph. Porsche vehicles are those manufactured by Dr. Ing. h. c. F. Porsche AG as indicated on their build plate.
- 1.2. Location: The photo must show that it was taken in the specified city, town or village. This is done by either:
 - 1.2.1. Including a municipal or quasi-governmental building in the photograph that clearly shows the name of the town on the building, or on a sign in front of the building.
 - Acceptable buildings include: town/city halls, post offices, police/fire stations, public works depots. Commercial businesses and places of worship are not acceptable as they are frequently named for a locale other than the one in which they are located.
 - 1.2.2. Including a roadside sign placed by a state or local government agency that clearly indicates the name of the locality and either the elevation or population.

Example 1: A photo submitted for Townville is taken with the main post office in the background. The name "Townville" clearly shows in the lettering on the front of the building, or a free-standing sign in front of the building identifying it as the post office.

Example 2: A photo for Hamlet was taken at the village border where there is a municipal or state sign placed by the side of the road reading "Welcome to Hamlet, elevation 1,234 feet"

These are the basic's, and the <u>full rules are posted on the Web site</u> to view. Simply put, have your camera with you and get yourself or your Porsche in the picture when you visit any town. Make sure the name of the town is in the picture!! Have fun, and at the end of the year, let's see who gets every letter of the Alphabet covered!! <u>You</u> may be the one to get the Award!!



Ground Breaking Four-Door GT to be Offered with Porsche Hybrid System


ATLANTA--(BUSINESS WIRE)--Jan. 7, 2008--Dr. Ing. h. c. F. Porsche AG, Stuttgart, announced today that it is developing a hybrid drive version of its highly anticipated fourdoor Gran Turismo. The Panamera Hybrid will utilize the same gas-electric drive concept as the Cayenne Hybrid that comes to market at the end of the decade and will claim a remarkable 30% reduction of fuel consumption.

The full parallel hybrid system of the Panamera will be configured with the battery unit positioned below the luggage compartment, and hybrid module, comprising of an additional clutch and electric motor, will be between the engine and transmission. Depending on driving conditions, the hybrid module has the ability to disengage either the combustion engine or the electric motor, or to combine both drive systems as one joint power unit.
