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
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

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
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Diablo PCA's Mille Tour had a wonderful turn out from various Pcars, including two very savvy Carrera II and a GT3 drop in's. Not only was the event fun, the number of participants was far higher than I expected. which added to the a parlance of some spirited adventuring. Starting from Easy Porsche in Emeryville and ending in Bodega Bay, the trip included seeing the surprise location where Sir Alfred Hitchcock directed his Academy Award winning film, THE BIRDS. With no less than one picturesque toll bridge, 100 twisty curves, 1000' of vertical elevation the conditioned cars forged a path through the changing asphalt. A jaw dropping section of the route included a fairly unknown back road used for California Mille touring of vintage cars. Extremely beautiful, it sliced into up, through and around the Northern mountainside face of Mount Tam to a gorgeous dam and waterfall. 

Locke was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1971 and further was designated a National Historic Landmark District in 1990 due to its unique example of a historic Chinese American rural community. It is a town built completely "by the Chinese for the Chinese" and can be considered a distinct rural Chinatown enclave. Like many other Chinatowns, it had a Chinese-language school, general stores, and restaurants. Because of its relatively large population of Chinese people at the time, the Chinese Kuomintang political party once had a local chapter in Locke.



After a short break, we journeyed on towards Marysville and onto Penn Valley for lunch. My temperature gauge in the car registered 107 degree. Here is a possible way to improve your Track or Autocross driving. Why not mount a Digital camera inside your car? With this camera you can then review your driving and possibly see where an improvement could be made. What I have done is mount a Digital camera in my Cayman "S". Here is a picture.....



The camera is Rock Solid. I am not sure how you would mount yours. My car has a bar going between the two seats so it was an easy mount. 911 and Boxster owners should be able to either attach a bar across the back of the seats, or adapt it in another way. Hopefully this could work for all people interested.

Since I wrote my last column we've had a wonderful tour to Grass Valley and the longest single-span covered bridge in the US, and a fabulous driving tour along the Pacific coast to Bodega Bay that followed a segment of the California Mille vintage car event. My thanks to members Ken Wu and Tito Young for coordinating these events. And in addition our members were able to enjoy a special Porsche-only run group at a Saturday track event through an arrangement with Hooked on Driving, which you can read more about elsewhere in this issue. Finally, if you crave something different from the usual tour, I hope you were able to attend our Gimmick Rally on July 26th.

It's time to solicit candidates for the board of director elections Diablo will be holding in October. We will have five (5) positions open, and not all incumbents will be standing for another term. I've been renting a mailbox since just before I move to Berkeley from Boston. It's convenient to have a secure place to receive packages that I can access 24x7, so I've kept it. Yesterday when I picked up my mail, there was an envelope from the Nevada DMV. Inside was a pair of license plates. I've never lived in Nevada, and certainly haven't registered a car there. At first I thought it was odd. Then I worried it was the first sign of identity theft...

It was after 6PM when I picked up my mail, so there was nothing to be done about it then. This morning I started trying to remember how to get my free annual credit reports, to see if there was any indication of identity theft. You can obtain your free credit reports from annualcreditreport.com – this is the one overseen and recommended by the Federal Trade Commission. I hadn't checked my credit reports since 2005, which is not smart. Everybody should do it at least once a year, and since everybody is eligible for a free annual report from each of the major agencies (Experian, Equifax, and TransUnion) you can rotate and check one every 4 months at no cost.

There was nothing on my credit report, but then there could be a 30-60 day lag before things show up there. So I called the Nevada DMV and asked why I had received these tags.

DMV: Do you own an '06 Subaru?

SMJ: No.

DMV: Do you own an '05 VW?

SMJ: No.

DMV: Do you have a wife, ex-wife, or girlfriend?

SMJ: None of the above...

DMV: The name "Mary" doesn't mean anything to you?*

SMJ: Sorry, no...

DMV: Let me transfer you to Special Plates.

I went back and forth with a few more phone reps who quickly clammed up and said they couldn't share any information about the registration because they couldn't really verify who I was. Understandable, given that they didn't have any record of my identity in their systems – that first phone rep shouldn't have mentioned the name "Mary" to me. The senior rep suggested this might be identity theft, and after a while transferred me to another desk to ask about filing an incident report.

While waiting on hold I realized two things. I had a first name for this person, "Mary." And there was no first name or box number on the envelope's mailing label. What if there was a Mary Jones who also rented a box at the same establishment? I called the mailbox place and sure enough, they have a Mary Jones. About that time my line was picked up at the DMV and I explained the whole thing again. They confirmed that there were no records in their systems with my complete address or my social security number associated with them.

So it looks like this was an innocent mistake – this time. At least it prompted me to review my credit report this year, and it only cost me half a day to clear up. But on the whole, I prefer adrenaline or coffee when I need to get my heart pumping...

Looking ahead to August, I am trying to confirm a scheduled morning tour to the Monterey Historics on the 16th. There is also a region barbeque being developed for Saturday, August 30th – hopefully this won't conflict with members' Labor Day plans, because I think this is going to be a spectacular event. Stay tuned for details.
