California Lifts COVID Restrictions Effective June 15th:

The California Department of Public Health has eliminated numerous COVID-19 restrictions effective June 15. The color-coded tier system for reopening businesses will be eliminated, allowing businesses to return to more normal operations with fewer restrictions and limitations. One major change is that the State will adopt the new mask recommendations recently issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) stating that people who are fully vaccinated no longer need to wear face masks or physically distance in most outdoor and indoor settings. This new guidance was based on additional studies regarding the effectiveness of the vaccines and the declining COVID cases that have resulted as the distribution of the vaccines continues.

For club activities such as autocross and driver education events, in car instruction may now resume with the exception that if the instructor is not fully vaccinated the choice shall be left up to the student on whether to request a fully vaccinated instructor, and vice versa. This option should be fully communicated before the start of instruction. However, if the track or the county in which the event is held has more stringent COVID restrictions, the most restrictive guidelines will prevail. For all other events including tech sessions, dinner meetings, tours and concours events, no restrictions will apply unless county restrictions or the venue in which the event is held is more restrictive.

Regarding the continued requirement for all participants to continue to sign the PCA Communicable Disease Waiver, PCA is still reviewing this issue and until further notice, all events moving or otherwise will require attendees to complete the waiver.

Roy Schauben and Simone Kopitzki have been working very hard this month conducting the hands on phase of the Zone Concours Judges School. With over 60 students registered for the 2 part training, 3 sessions were held in June with training on June 6th at Redwood City Porsche, June 13th at Hi Tech Automotive in San Rafael, and in the Sacramento area that was cosponsored by SVR on June 27th. 7 Bridges Tour

7 Bridge Tour. Sounds pretty straight forward. Drive around the Bay crossing 7 bridges along the way. But the group soon discovered the adventure would lead them beyond just making a big loop around the Bay. The entire excursion was highly organized by Carolyn Wong. She planned the route, making sure everyone had a copy of the step by step instructions; the groups were small, allowing for plenty of time to maneuver through traffic, even in downtown San Francisco. Each car had a radio, which meant communication was readily available. The three groups left each location in a staggered fashion, which helped keep things flowing smoothly.

The drive consisted of crossing over 7 very different styles of bridges, each one displaying its own distinct design spanning across two pieces of earth. After devouring the delicious breakfast provided by Porsche of Fremont, the tour began with the first bridge – Dumbarton Bridge. This bridge connects Fremont and Menlo Park and is the shortest bridge across the San Francisco Bay (1.63 miles). It was the first vehicular crossing over San Francisco Bay proper and opened in 1927. It was rebuilt in 1982.

We continued up the Peninsula and crossed the San Mateo-Hayward Bridge, the longest bridge in California and 25 th longest in the world (7 miles long). It opened in 1929 and included a drawbridge, but was rebuilt in 1967 to eliminate the drawbridge. It is so heavily used for commuting that it was widened to six lanes in 2003. It connects Foster City to Hayward and is parallel to and lies between the San Francisco-Oakland "Bay" Bridge and the Dumbarton Bridge.

Heading North, the next span quickly came into view-San Francisco-Oakland "Bay" Bridge. The bridge opened in 1936, a mere six months before the Golden Gate Bridge opened. The bridge is actually two sections, San Francisco to Yerba Buena Island and from Yerba Buena to Oakland, a total of 4.46 miles. Following the Loma Prieda earthquake, the bridge was reinforced adding additional lanes and labeled the world's widest bridge.

Then the driving fun began, as we started weaving our way through early morning traffic in the Marina District of San Francisco, making our way towards the beautiful and majestic Golden Gate Bridge. The bridge opened in 1937 connecting San Francisco to Marin County. Painted that glaring International Orange was not the only distinct feature. It was built with a suspension span design, capable of moving more than two feet laterally to withstand strong winds and the occasional earthquake.

After crossing the majestic Golden Gate Bridge, we headed to the Marin Headlands for a quick bio break and a chance to stretch our legs. The drive up the winding road along the side of the hill through a light fog was so typical of a San Francisco day. We were able to see some gorgeous views of the Bay as we made the journey up and down the hill. There are many highlights to this area that means another visit is required. Just a quick list of possible future adventures: Point Bonita Lighthouse, Nike Missile Silo, Fort Baker, hiking to Tennessee Valley or Rodeo Beach Lagoon.

We soon began our drive back towards the East Bay, crossing the Richmond-San Rafael Bridge, the northernmost of the East-West crossings of the San Francisco Bay. Logically, the bridge connects Richmond and San Rafael, a total of 5.5 miles in length. It opened in 1956, replacing the ferry service.

Smooth driving and a nice flow of traffic led us to the shortest bridge in our day of crossings – the Carquinez Bridge. It was constructed as a pair of parallel bridges spanning the Carquinez Strait at the

northeastern end of San Francisco Bay. The bridge lies between Crockett and Vallejo, a mere .66 miles on one span and .5 miles on the other. One span opened in 1927 and the second in 1958.

As we continued on the final piece of our journey, we all saw a very familiar sight, the Benicia Martinez Bridge. The structure replaced the last automotive ferry service crossing the Carquinez Strait between Benicia and Martinez. The bridge is a parallel structure; the first built in 1962 (1.2 miles) and the second in 2007 (1.7 miles). Between the two bridges is the Union Pacific Railroad Bridge that opened in 1930. This special bridge is used by both freight and passenger trains.

As we were cruising along all these different structures, heading to our final destination for lunch in Concord, I realized I really didn't know very much about most of the bridges we had just spent half a day crossing. So, that's what prompted me to investigate and compare some of the basic information on several well known pieces of real estate in our own backyard.

Those on the tour, I know had a fun day and I hope you will take time to explore and become acquainted with these 7 beautiful steel structures yourself.
