

Lake Sonoma Tour Taking a Perfect Day and Making It Better

The Diablo PCA Region conducts numerous tours throughout the year. If you were fortunate to have participated in the Lake Sonoma Tour, hosted by Carlos and Nancy Bocanegra, you would have had a memorable experience. As Carlos likes to say, "this was a wine friendly tour that meandered through the back of Lake Berryessa and through the famous Alexander Valley wine fields to arrive at Lake Sonoma."

The perfect day continues!

The tour was conducted on July 30, 2011 and began at the Vintage Caffe located at 2522 Mankas Corner Road, Fairfield, CA. This was a rather unique starting point when one considers that most of the Diablo tours originate from our usual breakfast haunts located in Pleasanton or Walnut Creek. However, the starting point



makes sense when you factor in the distance to the final destination and the points of interest on the way to Lake Sonoma. This was an elegant solution to getting the tedious and many times uninteresting portion of driving along major roads out of the way before commencing on the attention grabbing portion of the tour. It allowed participants the opportunity to adjust their driving to whatever time sequence they were comfortable with to arrive at the Vintage Caffe for a delicious breakfast before embarking on the tour.

Great organization and execution of the tour!

Upon arriving at the Vintage Caffe we were rewarded with attentive staff that ushered us into a private sequestered area where we met the other participants and ordered from a menu

tailored specifically for the Porsche Club. The food was delightful and well worth the drive. For myself, I selected the "Joes Special" Omelet and found it to be the very best I have ever had. Other choices on the menu included items such as Crab Cake Benedict and the usual breakfast dishes but with a flair for tickling the palate. It was evident that Carlos and Nancy put a lot of effort into the tour preparation. Introductions were made and each participant received a detailed tour guide that included descriptions, historical notes, areas of interest photos, and maps for each segment of the trip. As an example, did you know that the town of Angwin was named in 1874 for Edwin Angwin who ran a resort on the land the town now occupies? Or that Angwin is a Cornish surname meaning "the white" and is comparable to the English name "White"?



This is where it starts getting better!

Participating in the tour were many of the "usual suspects" you expect to find at our Diablo tours and the same people that make the activity worthwhile. Well this one included a host of new people that most of us had never met. It is always a rewarding experience to have the opportunity to make new friends at Porsche events. Porsches are incredible cars that instill passion in their owners and the Club provides the venue to channel the excitement and enthusiasm felt by their drivers. The new participants were eager and excited about the tour and each one had a great story waiting to be heard about their Porsche experience. I've got to tell you,

We formed up into two groups and left Mankas Corner, traveling on Gordon Valley Road for our first rest stop at the Lake Berryessa Visitors Center. This was a "spirited drive" along beautiful countryside many of us had never experienced. Taking Pope Canyon Road, we then stopped at the historic Pope Valley Repair & Towing.



AND---there were snakes! Nobody said anything about snakes! For those interested, there is a rattlesnake exhibit but this author declined.

We then took Angwin Santa Helena Road towards Calistoga. This was for the most part, an energetic drive along twisty and meandering roads as we proceeded to the Lake Sonoma Overlook. As we neared Geyserville, we encountered a massive bicycle race in progress. There was easily 20 miles or more of continuous bicycles and fortunately they were oncoming and on the opposite side of the road.

This is farm country and every so often you could see a chicken attempting to cross the road but impeded by the unremitting line of bicycles.

The Lake Sonoma Overlook is breathtaking! However, the pit toilets are breath holding. OMG, it was enough to gag a maggot.

The Lake Sonoma Overlook is a very worthwhile stop. There is a wooden walkway that takes you to the multi-level overlook where you can see, from a very high distance, the Sonoma Lake and recreation areas where you can rent houseboats and other water vehicles. 



10 Questions for the Track Chair

1. Does Porsche have track badges?

Yes. The emblem or badge on your bonnet/hood allows you to track your car at a Diablo Driver's Education Day. Really & When? Thursday, October 27th at Thunderhill Park for \$200.00 Novice through Advanced are invited with a Porsche. About the badge—you really don't need any stinkin' badges. Just bring a Porsche. A wise man said, "This is about Porsches for Porsche owners, and in particular for Diablo members" or was that a wise guy? This question has no real answer.

2. What if I don't have a Porsche?

Please visit our sponsor Porsche of Fremont and work out the details. Yes, this was blatant advertising.

3. What is DE (Driver Education) about?


It is all about just cornering, late breaking, having a good time, making new friends, speeding down the straight-aways at or above 100 mph with no red lights behind you. It is about you improving your Porsche driving skills and really getting to know your Porsche automobile. Participation in your run group is about 15 cars or less, though we prefer more cars. It is about you supporting your club and about you taking advantage of the 2nd of two DE Days this year. This event could be gone tomorrow due to lack of support and you could end up in some outside event driving alongside 'rental cars'.

4. Do I need to achieve fast track times or will someone make fun of me if I am slow?

Truth is someone will make fun of you, but you will never know it, as the chatter comes from the corner markers: they have to have fun too! To the point if you are too slow—you will be asked to come into the Pit Area so that you have time to discuss your technique and speed with the instructor. This event is guaranteed to make you smile and not cry. And, it is not easy going fast when you have a lot to concentrate on while on the track.

5. Will this hurt my new or old car?

Believe it or not, this is a concern for brand new car owners as it is for old car owners. You have to understand that you are out there about 4 times in the day for about 20-25 minutes. There is



traffic and passing is controlled. Think in terms of 1 mile on the track will be about 10 road miles, so if you go a maximum 4 laps (track is 3 miles around) in one session, you have traveled about 120 road miles in those 20 minutes. If you do three session, you would have traveled 360 road miles—did that hurt your car? If you are a sloppy shifter—maybe, but just maybe or just time to consider PDK. The answer to the question in "no, this did not hurt my car". One important note, your instructor will drive your car at least once and they will drive it fast. Do not become

Alarmed. They are certified and it is preferred that you do not make them certifiable. Your cooperation is appreciated. It is best if there are at least 1,000 miles on your car unless you own a GT3, etc.

6. Will I crash my car?

I doubt it—and your instructor will appreciate you not crashing into anything, as a matter of fact they are quite happy when you stay on the track and this is usually the case. Certified not certifiable is the key. By the way, there are no walls to speak of at the park. Yes, there are swings at the park. Just Kidding!

7. Do I need to buy a helmet?

No, but you can rent one at the track, as you are required to wear one. And, yes, you will have a bad hair day.

8. If I have a cabriolet/convertible, can I drive with the top down?

No. Rules are Roles (I dislike this rule).

9. You can't make me participate in a DE Day, if I am a Diablo member—right?

That is correct I can't make you participate, but I want you to take advantage of something very important—tech inspections at Kahler's and Porsche of Fremont. Even if you have a new car, please take advantage of this event. First of all it is mandatory to have sign-off to attend, but take a moment to look under your car—you do not want surprises. Remember, you are in a mechanical animal with moving parts and anything could be going wrong; e.g., nails in tires, loose lug nuts, oil leak, etc. **Don't believe me?** Show up and we will show you. It is important to remember a Porsche is low to the ground (cayenne expected) and difficult to get underneath to do your own inspections.

10. Why do you have to be silly?

Because, I can't sing and I'm keeping my day job. I don't have a dog named "Spot". It is very difficult to rach out to over 1,000 members. Honestly, I don't know how to make you come to the track.
