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


Off and running for 2013, our March 15th event is open for registration. Once again, our format will include a classroom session for both new track drivers and experienced, who like to compare notes, pick up tips and share experiences. More to follow very shortly - keep watching the website for further details.

We will be going to Thunderhill again on September 5th, which will guarantee sunny dry weather, plus we have Mazda Laguna Seca on November 26th, which will be immediately after two days of PCA GGR.

This year, deciding to use new technology to help my driving I did two things, I upgraded my latter-day Smartphone for one of today's genuine smartphones! What a revelation...I can now time laps, overlay satellite GPS data, analyze cornering speeds, split times and simultaneously record the video evidence. All this can be done with mounting the phone to a sucker attached to my windshield. It doesn't even seem to impact battery life that much...but even if it does, I have a phone charger connected anyway. Uploading recordings and data to a website happens automatically and I can calculate, graph and view my driving inconsistencies...!

The second thing I did was buy some new driving shoes which are comfortable and allow me to better bridge the wide gap between brake and throttle for 'heeling and toeing'. My legs are too long to enable me to bend my right foot outwards in driving position, but at least my new shoes make it easier to blip the throttle when braking. It makes a big difference for a relatively small outlay and well worth making sure they are comfortable when walking around the pits too.

If you went to the Blackhawk Event on Sunday 27th you will have seen that the Diablo DE Program was recognized with a couple of awards which were great recognition for the hard work we have put in over the last 15 months. I would like to thank everyone who helped and contributed. For details of what we did, look back to the Advocate article in December.

The team is growing. You'll see Jeff Urnes and Mike McDonald as Chief Driving Instructors, Kay Maloy managing events at the track (and behind the scenes), Adam Cipriano managing the critical connection of Motorsportreg.com, as well as Ed Won, Dave Ohst, Chris Fortich, Steve Jones, Dan Lederman, Ken Wu, Tom Davenport and Carlos Bocanegra. MILITARY VEHICLE TECHNOLOGY FOUNDATION TOUR

A crisp and clear Saturday morning greeted the 30 or so Diablo Region members that gathered at Mimi's for the first tour of 2013 to "The Military Vehicle Technology Museum" in Portola Valley. Most of us who gathered there probably had no idea of the magnitude and scope of the collection we were about to see. After a short driver's meeting with tour leader Lillie Echevarria, we formed two run groups and we were off.

Lightly used roads greeted our Porsches as we sped west towards the San Mateo Bridge, and then to even-



tually wind our way up to the beautiful Crystal Springs area. After briefly stopping to assure all cars were regrouped and gathered, we continued on to the Redwood and Oak tree lined Skyline Blvd towards Alice's Restaurant for our brief respite stop. What a tranquil area! Many people who enjoy back-road tours of the coastal peninsula seem to find their way to this crossroad area. Frequented by touring cars, motorcycles, and bicycle riders, this is truly a one of a kind place, and can be quite bustling on weekends.



Off again, we were on our way to Portola Valley for lunch at Portola Kitchen. A great time was had by all as we sat outside under the welcome heaters, and enjoyed dining on tasty and well

prepared entrees cheerfully served by their gracious staff.

Departing in timely fashion for our One o'clock date at the museum,

we threaded our way through the tranquil emerald green rolling hills of Portola Valley. What a secluded gem this area is for the fortunate that reside there! It is a true retreat from the Silicon Valley congested developments. Arriving at the Museum, we found our way up a long private entrance to arrive in a truly grand courtyard surrounded by immense buildings with a lineup of heavy tanks waiting for us. We parked our group in front of the massive tanks and eagerly awaited the tour to start.



We were not to be disappointed as for the next 2 hours we were given one of the most interesting, informative and stimulating tours I have ever experienced. Our tour docent, Neil, delivered the descriptive narrative in such a way that he was able to weave the personal experiences of the fighting men who served in these machines, their technological development, and their design successes and failures, as well as their place in determining the pivotal outcomes of WWI and WWII.



This private collection of over 250 military battle vehicles was the brainchild of Jacques Littlefield. The Stanford Alum grew up not far from where this collection resides on his massive estate of hundreds

of acres of prime Portola Valley hillside beauty. His collection of military armor is truly one of the most comprehensive in the world, if not the most! It is truly amazing that one person starting out in the mid-seventies could assemble this collection on his own and doing the needed restorations as well. Unfortunately he lost his ten year battle with cancer in 2009 at the young age of 59.



The collections focus, while having many other examples, is mainly on the development of the heavy armored battle tank, and the complete restoration of these rare pieces. Most of them were painstakingly disassembled and laboriously rebuilt to exactly as they were when new!! The collection traces the history of armored fighting vehicles with examples of some of the first that appeared towards the end of the First World War, all the way to the first Gulf War, with extensive examples of tanks from World War II. Many of the



examples are extremely rare, some being among only a handful that still exist of their models. American Armour is well represented as would have been expected, but the real surprise is how many fine examples of German and Russian Armour this collection has, including an extremely rare Tiger Tank that was designed by Professor Ferdinand Porsche.

We all exited this tour surprised by how engaging this museum tour was and impressed at the ability of one man to engineer such an astounding collection on his own motivations! We also all left with a profound awareness of how brave these soldiers were, and how hard these machines were to live, operate and fight in, and how they required substantial sacrifices by all the fighting men who bravely served in them.

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
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CASUAL TOUR SERIES: TOUR 1
