Other Comments: I have never really been into cars as such and have always considered them a mechanism to get you from point A to point B. Growing up in meager circumstances can add to your skepticism about peculiarities of a vehicle.

I was born in India and moved to the USA in 1986 to do my MBA, ended up staying here as I was offered a job right out of college. Many years of struggle ensued (financial and kids health) that I won't bore you with, but suffice to say, owning a vehicle was mostly a prosaic activity-ho hum Civics and the minivan phase. I never had any interest in pursuing a sports car much less a Porsche.

About 6 to 8 months ago, my very close friend (who also happens to be a realtor) showed up at my house in her 1985 Porsche 911 Convertible. She had ordered it from Germany and had it custom made for her. In fact, her name is on a sticker on the driver side door jam. She had the top down (not hers, the cars) and it looked fantastic. I jokingly told her that she should let me borrow it so I could take my wife to Half Moon Bay and get her brunch at the Ritz Carlton. We laughed about it and when she was ready to leave, she told me that I could seriously take the car whenever I wanted. She went on to explain how she never drove it and she wanted someone to take the car out on the road regularly. I hesitatingly accepted her offer. I am always nervous about borrowing anything of high value. I would hate to damage it or cause any other harm to such a nice car.

Other Comments: Thanks for the welcome. I've been a Porschephile for over 40 years, so I guess it's time I joined PCA. I started looking for the "right" Cayman, nationwide, in the summer of 2015 and found it in Houston, TX last May. I had my fiancé's brother-in-law check it out for me, since he lives close by and is a Corvette owner. Based on his evaluation, numerous pictures, Carfax and service records, I bought it sight unseen, had it shipped here and took possession on May 25th. It's a 2009 Cayman, base, with 20,053 miles (when I bought it,) 6 speed, grey with black interior. The seller was asking \$32k but took off \$500 to split the shipping costs. Since it was garaged and very well cared for, it's in great shape. A couple of rock chips but the finish is has very little spider webbing, so the previous owner did a great job!

This is my fourth Porsche, but I had to include 2 pictures of my first one, a 1972 914. I bought it new from Martin Johnson in Oakland for something like \$4,900 out the door, drove it for 4 years and 60k miles and sold it in 1976, never to see it again. Until last September, that is, when I brought the Cayman to my mechanic in Oakland for some service. As I drove up, this yellow 914 caught my eye and I thought, "no way!" but sure enough, the right license plate and original brown interior, which I special ordered. Turns out ,one of the mechanics bought it from someone whose relative had stored it for a few years. I sold the 914 to buy the silver 1969 912 from Wolfgang Reif, who owned German Competition Motors in Hayward. It was also in prime shape but after about 10 years and 2 kids, had to sell it. A few years later I bought the 1986 944. That was a fun car but expensive to maintain.

The Cayman was my retirement gift to me, which I did a month after I got it. Originally, it was going to be a daily driver ,but with 6 grandkids and needing to be able to haul my bike around, etc., it's become the fun car. All the better! We like taking it out on weekends and short trips or just taking it out when I feel like it. It's been the best combination of power and handling of the four and I love the sound of the engine as you go through the gears! That said, I think I'll take it out today! Happy Driving!

Other Comments: I purchased this car from my neighbor in August of 2016, but this was after spending the two previous years fixing it up for her before I actually bought it. Its sort of been 'my car' since January of 2014.

This is an original Bay Area car sold new in Redwood City and has never left - I'm only the 3rd owner and the first new one since 1980. The car actually sat in a garage for 15 years until I began restoring it for my neighbor. The manuals, tool kit and tire inflator are all original. The cracked and hazed paint is original. Even the Blaupunkt cassette deck was installed in 1980! The original 2.7 CIS motor actually runs very, very strong - (Even with the California smog parts!)

Porsche Option M numbers are:

400 - Pressure cast wheels (Design 90) (Fuchs alloys)

418 - additional decorative strips (chrome trim on wheel arch and rocker trim)

474 - Sport shock absorbers Bilstein

496 - Black colored parts instead of chrome (window and handle trim)

565 - Safety steering wheel 380 mm leather

650 - Electric sun roof

Since purchasing it, I removed the aftermarket fog lamps and filled holes on the front valance, lowered the car to Euro ride height, installed rear Euro bumper tips and filled extra holes, installed front side marker delete strips (Euro), and clear front turn signal. I also installed a factory oil cooler kit in the correct location.



Porsche Fun Facts

In 1948, Ferry Porsche (the son of Ferdinand Porsche, founder of Porsche) introduced the company's first production model, the Porsche 356 coupe. It has been a steady ride uphill from there. Featuring sleek curves, luxurious styling, and a powerful engine, Porsches are high-performance cars built to trump other vehicles on the road. The following are six fun facts about Porsches.

6. Unexpected Beginnings

Although Ferdinand Porsche founded the company in 1931, Porsche did not begin to manufacture cars until nearly a decade later. Instead, the company offered motor development and consulting services. For instance, Ferdinand Porsche is credited with the design of the bestselling Volkswagen Beetle. The company also contributed to the design of Tanks during the Second World War.

5. The Most Popular Porsche

The most popular machine from the Porsche factory is the Porsche 911. Introduced in 1963, the car has remained in production, with newer generations featuring fresh upgrades. A notable upgrade was the switch in 1998, after more than three decades, from using air-cooled engines to water-cooled engines—a change that remains with modern Porsches.

4. Unique Colors

Buyers of Porsche can opt to have their cars custom painted in any color (for a set fee). Porsches have been painted Silver, Magenta, Irish Green, Light Yellow, and Peru Red. However, the majority of Porsche cars feature the popular Red, white, and black colors of the company.

3. Forced Name Change

Early versions of the 911 were referred to as Porsche 901s. But after Peugeot successfully challenged the Porsche's naming system, which infringed on their rights to name cars with three-digit numbers marked by a zero in the middle, Porsche changed the name of the 901s to the 911.

2. SUV Success

Porsche did not build an SUV until the 2003, when it launched the Porsche Cayenne. Faced with struggling sales in the sports-car section, the company's CEO made the decision to expand the company's target market. The SUV's superior technology combined with its luxurious styling and the recognition of the Porsche brand ensured that it was an instant success.

1. Logo History

Porsche's coat of arms is not exactly unique to the company. The company drew inspiration of its logo from the Coat of Arms of Stuttgart, at one time the capital of the Free People's State of Württemberg. The horse in the logo references Stuttgart's origin, as the city was built site of a stud farm
