

Is This Real Life? Delivery Day at Porsche Experience Center, Los Angeles

"Ready?" my driving instructor Ricky asked. He stood at the rear of my custom-ordered Porsche, holding one end of a black sheet. I was seconds away from seeing my car for the first time.

We'd just finished a 90-minute track lesson at the Porsche Experience Center (PEC) in Los Angeles, where I was taking delivery of a 718 Cayman. On the track, I learned about oversteer, understeer, and the whys and hows of vehicle performance and handling. I practiced proper braking and hitting my apexes on a 1.3-mile handling circuit. I launched the car down a 1-mile acceleration straight and around a Nurburgring-inspired carousel.



I had a blast on the heart-pounding, high-speed sections of track. But the most fun? The slower-speed yet higher-intensity low-friction circuits and kick plate. I thought they paralleled gymnastics, a sport that combines powerful athleticism with graceful agility. As a gymnast, I appreciate the skill and precision required for quick hand-over-hand steering while braking and accelerating at the exact right times. It reminded me of the exactness and fluidity of being on my favorite event, balance beam.


Before we left the track, Ricky took over as driver and cut loose. He drove all the sections I'd practiced, so I was able to feel how they were meant to be driven, and identify what I need to work on the next time I visit.

My delivery specialist Charles met us inside. The three of us walked to a private room where my car was waiting for me under the black sheet. My name was splashed on a TV screen with a message: "Welcome, Ms. Carrie Deakin, to the Porsche Experience Center in Los Angeles." I snacked on a chocolate croissant and M&Ms that matched the color of my new car.

Then it was time for the big reveal.

My heart raced. Four months of waiting, finally over! I set my iPhone to record the delivery of my baby. "I'm ready," I said through the giant grin on my face.

Ricky counted, "3...2...1," and slowly pulled the sheet back. I saw the loud splash of Miami Blue. He continued pulling the sheet, off the hood, over the roof, and off the trunk, but my gaze remained fixed on the front end. This was my Miami Blue 718 Cayman with the black and chalk interior. My first brand new car. My first Porsche



I felt outside of my body. I think I said, "That's really my car!" But in my head there was another conversation happening.

New, Porsche-owning Carrie: "Is this real life? I own a Porsche now."


Old, non-Porsche-owning Carrie: "Dude, it's just a car." Both Carries: Then why does it feel so frickin' amazing?!

After Ricky walked me through the features and good-to-knows of my car, I had to sign my star. Everyone who takes delivery at PEC signs a numbered, magnetic star that goes on the wall in the delivery room. I'm number 221.

"Throw it up there," Charles chided. The magnet was too light to make it from where I was standing in the center of the room. I walked closer and made a dramatic, discus-like throw. It didn't stick to the wall, but Charles and Ricky roared with laughter.

"We tell everyone to throw it but you're the first one to actually try!" Charles said.

With the main attraction taken care of, I went up for lunch overlooking the track at Restaurant 917. In all my excitement, I'd barely eaten that morning, and I was famished. I ate an absurd amount of food — an item from every course on the menu, plus 3 baskets of these amazing pretzel roll things (I would go back to Restaurant 917 for those alone) — and savored every morsel. I mean, when was the last time I took delivery of a Porsche in an exclusive, VIP experience? Oh, right.



After lunch Charles took me outside to the front entrance, where my car was staged on a runway in the middle of the parking lot. He handed me the keys and a swag bag filled with Porsche goodies and mementos from my delivery, including a memory card with photos from the morning (yes, a PEC photographer followed me around like I was a celebrity).

Charles also took care of the smallest of details for me, like mounting my temporary license plate, packing my purse and other personal items in the frunk, and even laminating my insurance card. The many thoughtful touches throughout the day blew any expectations I had for my delivery day out of the water. It was the high-end, concierge experience I didn't even know I'd hoped for.

Keys in hand, it was finally time to start the drive back to the Bay Area in my Porsche. I turned the engine on and drove down the runway, out of the lot, and onto the open road . . . er, packed LA freeway.


