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From the Editor

My first Porsche story begins in the fall of 1958 in Santa Barbara, more specifically in Montecito, where I taught and coached at Westmont



College. My '56 Ford Victoria hardtop was beginning to rattle and shake while chewing up tires on the twisty Montecito mountain roads. Sports cars were big in Santa Barbara and everyone said I should ditch the Ford. I am not a small person, but nevertheless made the rounds of the typical British sports car dealerships driving MG Midgets, Sprites, Healeys and the like. I also test drove a '56 Thunderbird, which, unfortunately, was too much like my own unwanted Ford. Nearly all the options were front engined, had big trannies where my hips wanted to be, and required squishing my legs into the long flat tunnel toward tiny pedals.

I finally found a used car lot on State Street where I saw a strange coupe with gray steel wheels. It was as unimpressive visually as it was unfamiliar in my experience. This will sound a bit far fetched, but I believe it to be true. The test drive up and around the Montecito roads opened a new world that impacted my life for the next 45 or more years. The car was a middle blue '54 Porsche. It handled so precisely and was so tight structurally that it immediately became an obsession. The doors opened, closed, and fit as if they were handmade by jewelers or watchmakers. I was unable to erase that test drive from my thinking.

My income dictated a used, rather than new, Porsche so I used my twice weekly (basketball games) trips the LA area to visit the VW/Porsche dealership used car lots, but found nothing that I wanted. I eventually returned to my Central Valley home and tried the Fresno VW/ Porsche lot. They had nothing but did suggest that I try a farmer in Sanger.

It turned out that there was a raisin packer in Sanger who had a ship to take his raisins to Germany, and that he brought a Porsche or two on the trip home. The raisin farmer had just received his new Porsche and, with little or no market for used Porsches in the Fresno area, was about to wholesale the old 356 to LA.

The deep red '57 coupe had 32,000 miles

on it ("just a baby" was the quote on my first visit to a Porsche mechanic) and the price was \$2,900.



The '57 was our getaway car at my Montecito marriage in June of 1960. The honeymoon included Monterey (photo above) and Yosemite, i.e., my very first but not last Yosemite Porsche tour.

It is possible that this is the first Yosemite visit by an eventual Diablo Region member. Anyone visit Yosemite in a Porsche prior to June, 1960? If so, let me know and I will try to find a prize or other recognition.

Otherwise and in general, *Advocate* affairs are gaining momentum. More ads, more ad inquiries, more photos submitted and lots of healthy energy.
