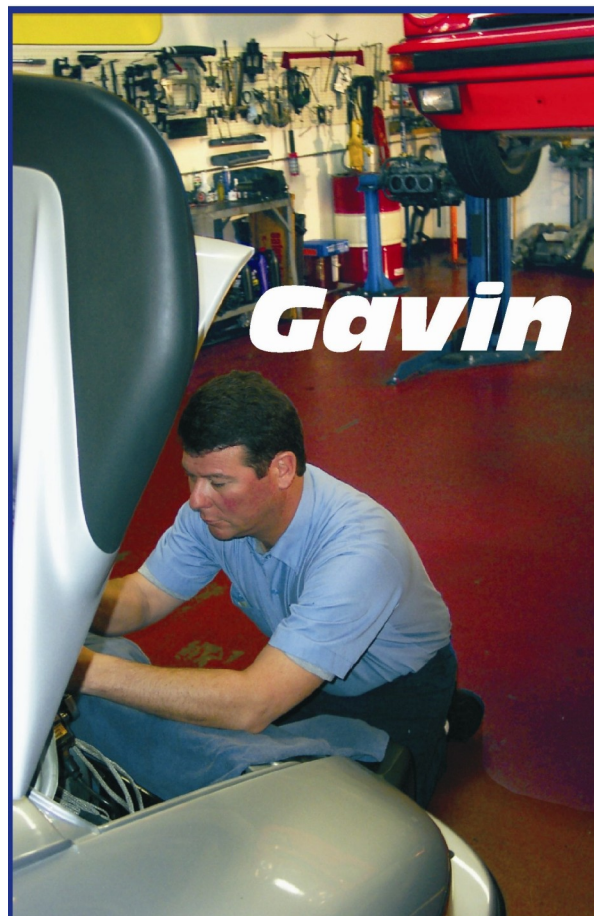

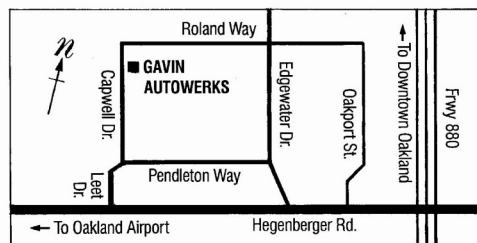

Electronic Voting in the 2010 Board of Directors Election

During the 2008 election Diablo members were asked to ratify a number of changes to the bylaws. One goal of these changes was to allow for voting in our annual elections to take place online. However we weren't able to add this kind of capability to the old website. With the change to a new website earlier this year, it is now possible.

Timeline

On October 5th Doug Wiebe, our Membership Chair, will use the email broadcast service offered by PCA National Headquarters to send each of you a message containing a link to an online ballot. If you have never provided PCA with an email address, you've been missing out on lots of useful information, event announcements, and money-saving opportunities. To correct this, go to <http://www.pca.org> and update your information today!

Voting will be allowed from receipt of the email on October 5th, through midnight Pacific time on October 25th. Any ballots submitted after that time will only be used to resolve a tie.

Eligibility

According to the region bylaws, any Active Member in good standing may vote in the election. An Active Member is one who qualifies for membership by owning, co-owning, or leasing a Porsche is 18 years of age or older, and who is current with their dues. [Diablo Bylaws Article IV Section 2.A]

Each Active Member may also designate a Family-Active Member, who is "the other person of the Active Member's immediate family, also 18 years of age or older, restricted to wife, husband, sister, brother, son, daughter, mother, or father." To qualify this person would have been identified to PCA National at the time the Active Member joined or renewed.

Membership Numbers

Each Active and Family-Active member is issued a membership number by PCA National. This number appears on the membership cards sent out each year. If you cannot find your membership number, please contact PCA National at (703) 321-2111 or by visiting <http://www.pca.org>.

Number of Votes per Ballot

There are **five vacancies** being filled through this election. You may vote for up to five members by selecting from the nominated candidates or using the write-in area. If you vote for more than five candidates, your ballot will be invalid and will not be counted.

Duplicate Ballots

It is possible for a member to submit more than one ballot. However all ballots are time stamped, and only the first valid ballot from a given member will be counted.

Electronic Ballot

When you click on the link in the message you will receive on October 5th, you'll be taken to a page on the Diablo website with a form like the one shown here. Each section will be reviewed to make sure it's perfectly clear how to use the ballot.

2010 Board of Directors Election

This is the electronic ballot for voting in the 2010 Board of Director elections. Please follow these instructions carefully or your ballot may be invalid and your votes would not be counted. If you aren't sure how to use this ballot, detailed instructions appear in the October issue of our newsletter, [The devil's Advocate](#). A summary of those instructions appears below for your convenience, but for complete instructions please refer to the Advocate.

You can only vote for up to five candidates, including use of the write-in space. Only Active Members and one Family-Active Member can vote, and each must fill out and submit their own ballot. You must include your full name and PCA membership number. Voting will start on October 5th and end at midnight on October 25th. Only the first valid ballot submitted by an eligible member will be counted.

Personal Information

To use the electronic ballot you must identify yourself. When the election committee sends a paper ballot to your home, you have already been pre-validated by checking your membership status, name and address, et cetera. Because the email system provided by PCA National does not implement the rules our bylaws specify for voting eligibility, we must collect this information in order to validate ballots after they have been submitted.

Once ballots are validated the personal information will be separated so that the team counting the ballots will not be able to see which member cast the ballot they are processing.

Captcha Field

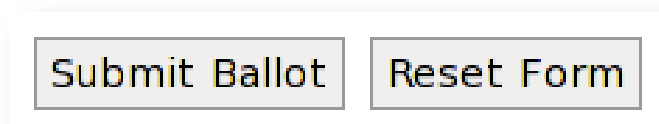
The Internet has made many things easier, including abuse. Spammers have created automated systems that scour the web looking for forums, blogs, and any other page that allows them to submit text. When they find them, they fill all available fields with marketing messages and submit as many times as possible. Unfortunately avoiding this requires an extra step from legitimate users.



A “captcha” (<http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Captcha>) tries to prevent this abuse by presenting an image that a program cannot process, but a human being can. The image is changed every time a given page or form is displayed. The user must look at the graphic on the left, determine what letters and/or numbers are being shown, and type them into the field provided. In this case, you would need to type “FHHE” into the field in order to successfully submit your ballot.

Submitting or Clearing the Ballot

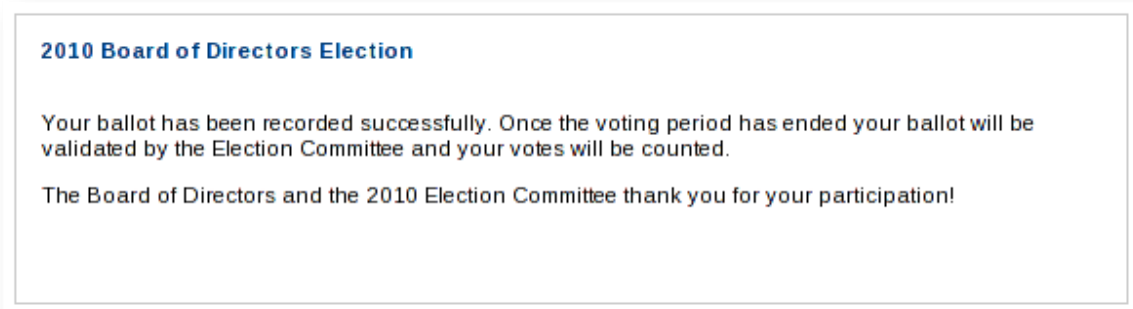
At the bottom of the form are two buttons. One will submit the completed ballot, and the other will reset the form so that you could start over if you wished.



If you are satisfied with your ballot and have entered all required information, you can click on the Submit button. If you wish to clear the form and start over, you can click on the Reset button.

Successful Submission


If you fill out your ballot and successfully submit it, you will be shown the following screen:



If you do not see this screen, your ballot has not been recorded. Please go back to the link in the email message and try again.

Unsuccessful Submission: Missing Field

Certain fields on the ballot are required. If you don't fill them in, your ballot will not be accepted. Here's the error that will be shown if you do not fill in a required field.

Afterwards: Processing Ballots

The current Board of Directors is taking a number of steps to maintain the integrity of the election process. For example, the link to the ballot will not be published here or on the main website. It will only be sent directly to members' registered email addresses.

When a member submits a ballot two copies are stored. One is recorded in a database, and the other is sent immediately via electronic mail to a mailbox established and controlled by the Membership Chair on behalf of the Election Committee. This mailbox will collect a running audit trail of the entire process as members vote.

The Webmaster maintains the database of ballots since it is part of the website. He is responsible for providing a complete record of the database to the Election Committee. In addition, he will attempt to automate the filtering out of invalid ballots—but this processing will be confirmed by a group of Election Committee members.

The validated ballots will then have all personal information removed before the votes are counted by a different group of Election committee members.

The entire process can be checked against the audit trail of individual ballots recorded by the Membership Chair.

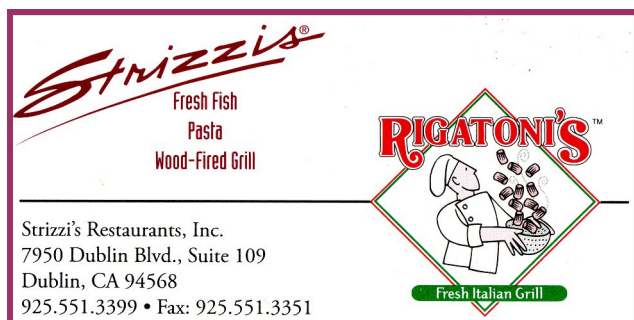

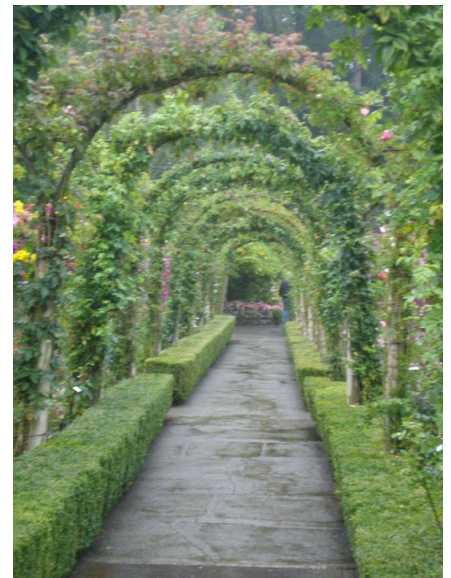

Escape 2010 - Looking in From the Outside

I could not get my act together, and I was a bit offended by paying nearly \$300 per head to participate in Escape, and I was not sure that it was worth the many miles on the car. There were plans. There was a caravan and in the end 2 cars and no real plans. Then came the notice that Escape 2010 was sold out and that the Delta Sun Peaks lodge was sold out. What to do? Nancy (my wife) said we should go; we have been wanting to see the Pacific Northwest for some time.

I volunteered to plan the route north – first we were leaving Monday, then Sunday, and finally we decided it was a holiday weekend, so let's leave Saturday after the Diablo Brunch.

For simplicity, I booked Best Western, as they had hotel/motel in all of the arranged 6-7 hour drives. In the company of great travel companions Ted and Ingrid French, we motored off from Marie Callenders to Medford, Ore. This included a ride into Ashland for dinner. The next day, we were off to Olympia, Wash, well actually Tumwater which is the backside of the state capitol. The fish were not on the fish ladders yet, so it was off to dinner at the Oyster House. We had to bed it early as the next leg would require an early rise and departure - 5 am. We headed west on 101 to Port Angeles, Wash. We needed to make the 8:30 Ferry and they want you there an hour early. The speed limits were low or rather alternating medium to low. You see deer; pass an Elk reserve, a jail, and a Sheriff's academy. Was my traveling companion willing to get there without me... let's not go there; we made it with 50 minutes to spare. Should you ever need to grab a Ferry with a destination, reserve them ahead of time. The ferry ride provided beautiful views into Victoria, BC. Customs was interesting and off we went to Butchart Gardens – even if gardens are not your cup of tea, you should go, as the place in rain (for us) and sun is extraordinary.

After a walkabout in Victoria and after the museum, it was off to the second ferry to Vancouver, BC. We met up with Lillie Echevarria for dinner although 10 minutes late. We did not see much of Vancouver as it was dinner and a sleep over. The darn hookers kept Nancy up most of the nights (this is a PG statement). If you are done laughing, you can catch us at Strizzis and ask about it – eh! Vancouver to Sun Peaks it was. We took the road via Whistler, a quick round mile walk to see a water fall, lunch in Lillooet, and a gas up in Kamloops and off to Sun Peaks. We checked out the hospitality suite for Escape and then headed over to our hotel. We ended up next door. British Columbia is truly beautiful.

Escape 2010, when you consider it is put together entirely by volunteers, was quite an endeavor. We did not participate in the planned meal sessions. We wandered around a bit and picked up the tour schedule. The parking lot had plenty of varied Porsches though most were underground. There was a daily place to wash your car – water was COLD! A Turbo, Panamera, Cayenne, and the Boxster Spyder were on display – for all to see. Among the sponsors was a glass art display aptly named GlassArt and Burmester sound systems (incredible –life like, as I thought they hired Ray Charles as an entertainer, only to find out it wasn't live, but Memorex). [Yes, I know that Ray Charles passed away in 2004].

There were varied tours from waterfalls, wine, and spawning Salmon tours. You could also play golf with the bears. There were also tech sessions. For us it was tours. We followed one tour for quite a way and made our way back. We saw a nice lake and ran into other solo Porsche drivers. We had a wonderful talk with a former Region director by the name of Botho von Bose. Then we drove around and took in COSTCO. Yep Costco, we started COSTCO tours in Hawaii. They sell burgers there of which we took advantage of for an early dinner. We stocked up as we had a kitchenette and fueled up as well at about \$1.02 (C) per liter.

We took another tour, but we went with Jacquie and Walt Lietz. The tour took us along the Adams River and
