



We all have other obligations and can't afford to always attend everything the Region schedules, but a reasonable amount of visibility and involvement helps keep the Region strong, diverse and growing.

We all have unique talents in our day-to-day jobs and functions that will bring vitality, excitement and a "breath of fresh air" to the Region. Now is the time to let your special skills be seen and bring together a new TEAM for 2014.

Board Elections Are Coming

Each October, Diablo Region members elect either 4 or 5 new Board members. This year we have four (4) positions that will need to be filled. We will be starting our search for individuals who would like to take on a more active role in how the Diablo Region functions. To assist in our search, we are providing a brief description of the Region Officers' responsibilities and duties.

President

Presides over all Region meetings; prepares the agenda and directs the discussion thereof; acts as an exofficio member of all standing committees and temporary committees except the Nominating committee; executes all documents and correspondence in the name of the Region as authorized by the membership or the Board of Directors. He/she may act as a signer or co-signer of Region checks. The President is responsible for returning the completed annual Region Report Form to the National Office, assuring that the new President of the Region has signed this report acknowledging receipt of this Manual and other Region property. The President should distribute the Region Officers' list of duties, below to the new Chairs, and this should develop into a specific discussion of what is needed and expected by both for the year.

The Region President should also utilize the feature of the PCA eMailer program to communicate with the Region's membership whenever necessary to discuss issues, or significant upcoming Region events. This can be delegated to one other Board member if desired.

The Region President is automatically a voting member of the PCA National Board of Directors which meets two times a year.

Vice President

Acts in place of the President during his/her absence or when ordered by the President to do so; assists the President and/or Board of Directors as may be directed.

Obtains insurance for events and forwards to the event lead or Chair. Ensures Observation Report is completed.

Secretary

Records and preserves the minutes of the meeting of the Region; presents and reads such minutes at the request of the President; prepares correspondence of the Region.

Prepares and conducts the election proceedings on behalf of the Board.

Treasurer

Keeps and preserves the records and books of account reflecting the financial condition and operation of the Region; signs or co-signs all drafts on the accounts of the Region and any corporate documents which obligate the Region financially; prepares and files IRS information and state taxing authority returns as required. Upon the request of the President, Board of Directors, or Region membership, furnishes a report of the financial transactions, receives all monies paid to the Region, and deposits it to the bank designated by the Region.

Membership Chair

Reports the current membership numbers to the Board each month; contacts new members and transfers in to welcome them into the Region; currently sends "blasts" using the eMail system to members on upcoming events.

Event Chair

Negotiates contracts for large events, such as Awards Dinner, Holiday Party, Planning Meeting to ensure the best expense for the Region; support event leaders to ensure they follow the established procedures for leading an event.

Hey Look! There's Nothing.

As human beings, we hate to look at nothing. We love to look at something. Anything. Even some things we don't want to look at, right? Have you ever been faced with something disgusting or ugly, but you looked at it anyway?

We like to look at problems, but not solutions. A car spins in front of us (a problem), and because of the way our brains are wired, we look at it. And the one thing we've all learned from our performance driver training is that we steer where we look. So, we steer toward the problem! What's wrong with us?! Why don't we look at the gap to either side of a spinning car (the solution)? Because there's nothing there. And we don't like to look at nothing.

Most people think of vision as something we have, but not something we can develop or improve. That's kinda like thinking you have a bicep muscle that you were born with, and there's nothing you can do to strengthen it.

When I talk about vision I'm talking about a lot more than just your "central vision acuity" - what your doctor checks when he has you read the eye chart. If you hold a quarter at arm's length, that is about all that we see with full clarity. Everything else expanding out from that quarter-sized circle begins to blur, more and more as it gets further from the center of our vision. That's where our peripheral vision comes in, and this is a critically important part of our vision skills that we need to be great drivers.

Depth perception, the ability to detect contrast and movement, and being able to process all of this information very quickly are all part of the vision skills we need. And just as we can develop the strength and flexibility of a muscle, we can also develop our vision skills, thus improving our driving.

Again, I'll come back to these points in future articles, but for now I'm simply planting a seed to allow you time to think about them.

Perhaps the most important attribute of a great driver has little to do with a physical ability, and more with a mindset or attitude.

In my experience, what separates the great from the not-so-great drivers is their attitude towards their development as drivers.

After thirty-something years of racing, instructing, coaching, writing about and talking about performance driving, the attitudes of drivers still amazes me. To sum these attitudes up in the most succinct way... the best drivers know they have so much more to learn, and the worst drivers seem to think they know it all.

I love it when I meet someone who has a strong belief in themselves. This confidence is a strong predictor of how successful they will be. The Henry Ford saying, "If you think you can or think you can't, you're probably right" comes to mind. Without a strong inner belief in oneself, it's unlikely you'll ever be as good as you could be.

But there's a fine line between having a strong belief and having an ego that's getting in the way of learning and being as good as you can be.

Great drivers have an open mind to learning. More than that, they have a burning desire to get better; they love to improve their performance. If I had to pick just one thing that separates the great from the not-so-great, it would be this open mind to both learning and constant improvement.

With that said, I'm hoping that you'll keep an open mind to what I write here in future articles. Here's to being a great driver!




