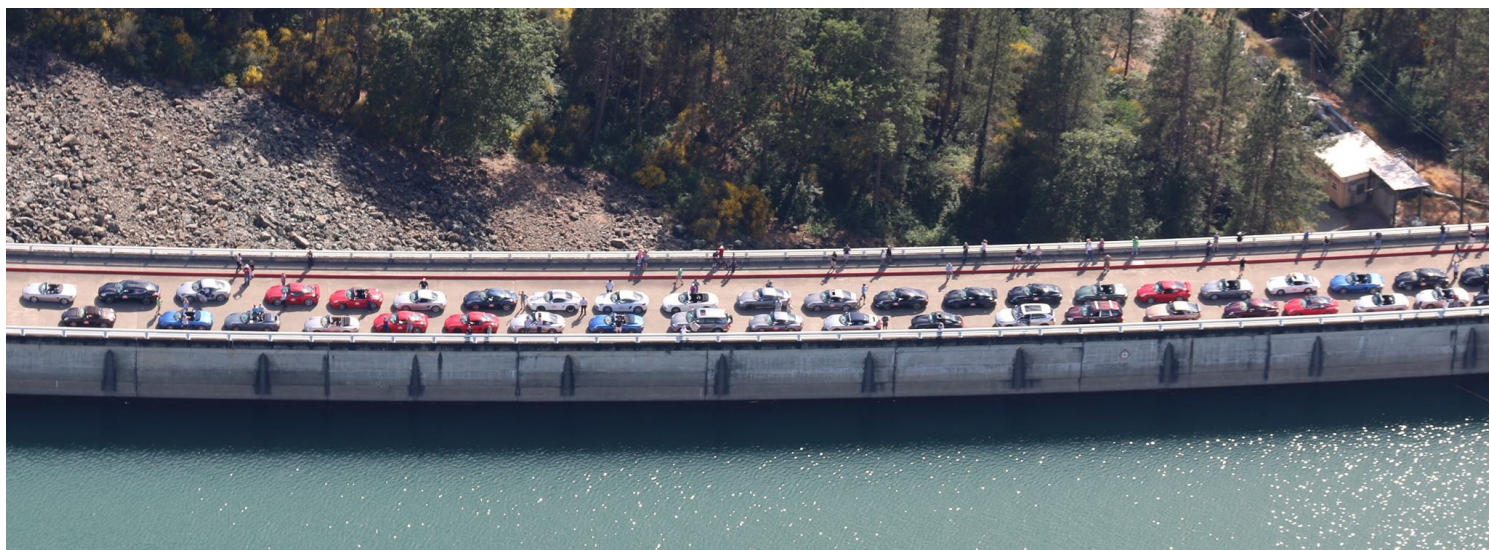

2019 Zone 7 Tour Overview--June 6-10, 2019



This is the well-known Shasta Four Day Tour through the mountains, valleys and scenic by-ways of Shasta, Trinity, Siskiyou, Tehama, and Lassen Counties. It is similar to the Tour held in 2018 which received high ratings. Participation is limited to PCA Zone 7 Members, and you must drive your later model Porsche. We require your vehicle to be in good condition, and recently serviced, since we travel at elevations as high as 6500 feet and we must be able to pass slow moving vehicles *as a Group*. Touring is a special skill set, so we will ask that you rank yourself as to your experience, so we can place you appropriately within your group, for safety purposes.

Each day involves about six hours of "seat time", so you will get to enjoy what your car was made to do---perform at its best, both using its power and its handling ability. You will be part of an 18 member team, with an experienced Lead Driver, a Sweep Driver and a Relay in the middle. We also require the use of two-way radios so that we can maintain constant communications. The end result is that we travel "as one", yet at speeds that are at the maximum of safety.

Redding is situated at the juncture of the Sierras, the Coastal Range and the Cascades. So each of the first three mornings, you will Tour with your group an average of 260 miles into these mountain ranges. The fourth morning you will check out of the Hotel, and take a short, 80 mile "roller coaster" Tour that drops you off on Interstate 5 for your ride back home.

TOTAL DRIVE TIME AND DISTANCE, Approximately 20:00 857 miles.

Your fee is based on either "One Person Per Car" or "Two Persons Per Car." It includes all fees, Tour costs, and meals (arrival day dinner is not included). Lunch is "on the road"; dinner is a banquet at the Host Hotel. We provide a breakfast buffet if you stay at the Host. ***You will, of course, book and pay for your own room separately.*** There is a block of rooms at a negotiated and discounted rate. This is a "LEED" (Green Certified) Facility.

This is a Charitable Event and any excess proceeds from the Tour will be donated to local charities.

Registration opens on ***January 28, 2019 at 7:00 am*** on **MotorSportReg.com**. You might consider having your Account created on that site in advance to be prepared. Last year, this Tour "Sold Out" in 90 minutes.

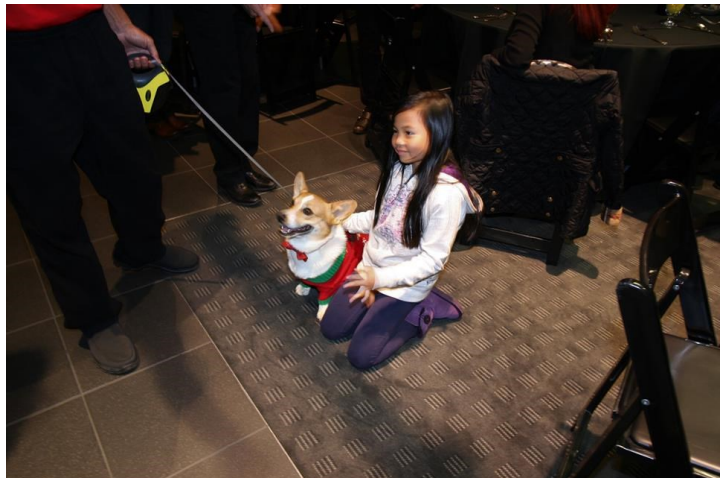

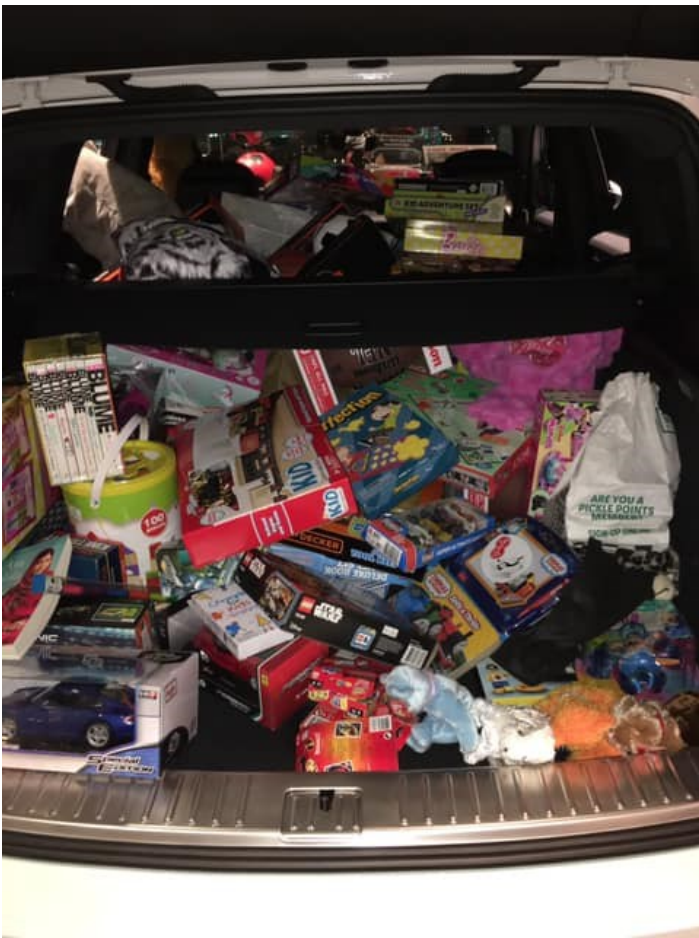

In The Zone - January 2019

I am honored to announce that I have been appointed by PCA's Executive Council to replace **Sandy Provasi** as your new Zone 7 Rep for the 2019-2020 term. Sandy has done a fabulous job over the last 3-1/2 years as our Zone Rep. With 20 plus years of PCA experience and the help of her equally experienced husband, Tom, I will have a tough act to follow. I would very much like to thank Sandy for her service and hope that I can continue in her footsteps. I have been a member of PCA and the Sacramento Valley Region since 2007 when I became actively involved in the region's autocross program. Several years after joining, I served as the club's autocross chair from 2012 to 2013

and again for one year in 2017. My regional board experience includes serving as the club's competition and safety chair from 2014-2015 and club president from 2015 to 2016. In 2016 the Sacramento Valley Region was selected as the PCA Region of the Year. For the past two years I have served as the club's past president as well as on our newsletter committee that publishes the award winning newsletter, the Drifter. I also served as the Zone 7 autocross chair in 2018.

Although many members have an understanding of the role of the Zone Rep, I thought I would spend a little time explaining. As defined by the PCA Bylaws, the Zone Rep's responsibilities are described below:

The National Bylaws state the Zone Reps are "responsible for the welfare and progress of the Regions within their zones". In fact, the Zone Reps are a bridge or liaison between the National and local organizations, working on behalf of the Regions and their members to enhance the membership experience, and to avail the Regions of opportunities offered through PCA. The Zone Rep position was originally created in 1969, when the Executive Council (EC) realized the club had grown too big for them to have direct relationships with all the Regions. They subdivided the country, aggregating the Regions into groups which evolved over time into the 14 Zones we now have. Each Zone has a Zone Rep, a position created to facilitate communication between the EC and the Region Officers.

The Zone Reps are emphatically not “Zone Presidents”; they do not direct or oversee Region Presidents. Rather they are a communications and management resource for the Regions in their Zone, and communicate the Region’s interests at the National level as appropriate.

The Zone 7 volunteer board consists of the Zone Rep, a secretary and a treasurer who each serve 2 year terms. The zone secretary and treasurer are approved by the presidents of the regions. The volunteer zone board members include, **Rik Larson**, Secretary, **Larry Adams**, Interim Treasurer, **Richard Chew**, Webmaster, **John D’Angelo**, Concours Chair, and **Grady Carter**, Autocross Chair.

The 10 regions which comprise Zone 7 include **Redwood, Shasta, Sequoia, Sierra Nevada, Golden Gate, Loma Prieta, Sacramento Valley, Diablo, Monterey Bay, and Yosemite**. As all of the regions begin their planning process for 2019, I will use this column to inform you of zone wide events that range from our yearly Zone 7 Tour, Concours and Autocross Series. Regularly serviced at Fremont Porsche and Michael Stead Porsche since I've owned it. All service records available. Major service completed 1,000 miles ago. New front brake pads and rotors installed under 300 miles ago. 8mm left on rear brakes. Car has always been garaged and covered, receiving regular full detailing, including clay, FLEX orbital polishing and paint sealant/wax jobs.

Things to Note

- I'm a PCA member, so the car has been tracked at HPDE events a handful of times. I run in the intermediate group, so not pushing it. The front bumper does have some rough spots that have scraped through the paint protection film.
- CARFAX shows two things: a minor accident in 2009 before I owned the car (vehicle operable, no structural damage, no airbag deployment)... all body work and body kits were done and added afterwards; repeated smog test failures in 2011 and 2013 as I tried to maintain a Techart exhaust and modified ECU mapping, it has since been returned to stock exhaust & settings and has easily passed recent smog tests.
- Three minor dings that could easily be removed by paintless dent repair: two dimples on hood from when I stuffed too much in the front trunk and one above the left rear wheel well.

Casey Moyer - Racing Update

When I last shared the exploits of Diablo’s aspiring young racer with you in the December 2017 issue of this fine periodical, Casey had just graduated from Kid Kart to the Cadet Class and he’d even gotten on the podium in his first race after only three practice sessions in a bigger, faster Kart.



As a new season got underway this past April our PCA Junior Member found himself campaigning two distinctly different engine packages in two different series. The Kart with which Casey won the NorCal Gold Rush Club Challenge, Jr. 1 title is the blue and gold Praga that we displayed, in Rothmans livery at our Annual Diablo Picnic as well as at RENNSPORT Reunion VI. Powered by a 206cc, four stroke Briggs & Stratton produces specifically for Karting, this motor puts about 6bhp, at around 7,000rpm, at the tips of Casey’s right toes. That equates to a top speed of around 55 mph, or about a 20mph

increase over last year’s Kid Kart top speed. At a minimum weight that went from 160lbs with Driver last year, to 240lbs with Driver for Jr. 1, wrestling the heavier machine through some of the turns was a bit of a challenge at first but fortunately, our young champion seems to enjoy doing push-ups and he’s grown like a weed this year.





Casey has another Kart, which we shared with the Saturday breakfast crowd, on our way to practice one morning, this past summer. The aqua colored Formula K, with which he competed in the Micro ROK class in Sonoma, is fairly similar to the Praga and uses the same wheel and tire size. It however, has a 60cc, two stroke engine, made by an Italian company called Vortex, that puts out about the same amount of power as the Briggs & Stratton, but at

twice the rpm and using a 112 octane race gas & oil mix. On the long straightaway at Sonoma, Casey has registered an even 60mph in the FK – not too shabby for a 9-year-old. As he did last year, Casey finished second in the Championship at Sonoma this season. We are pleased and encouraged by how well he did, splitting his time and focus between the two series, and we're hopeful that his experience with different power plants at numerous tracks will serve him



well, for as far as he hopes to take his racing career. Casey had a lot of fun meeting some of the current factory Drivers and Legends of the past at RENNSPORT as well as going on a parade lap of Laguna Seca and getting a glimpse of what the “Big Time” is like, so who knows?

Leaving Kid Kart with a second-place trophy from Sonoma and a third-place trophy from the KPX series, we were very pleased with the progress our Son made last season and Casey has really managed to keep up the pace in terms of continuing to develop his driving ability as well as his race craft, this year as well.

As always, I would like to express many thanks to our fellow Club Members who've offered their support and to those who have come out to see Casey Drive. I hope to provide you these updates, for many years to come.

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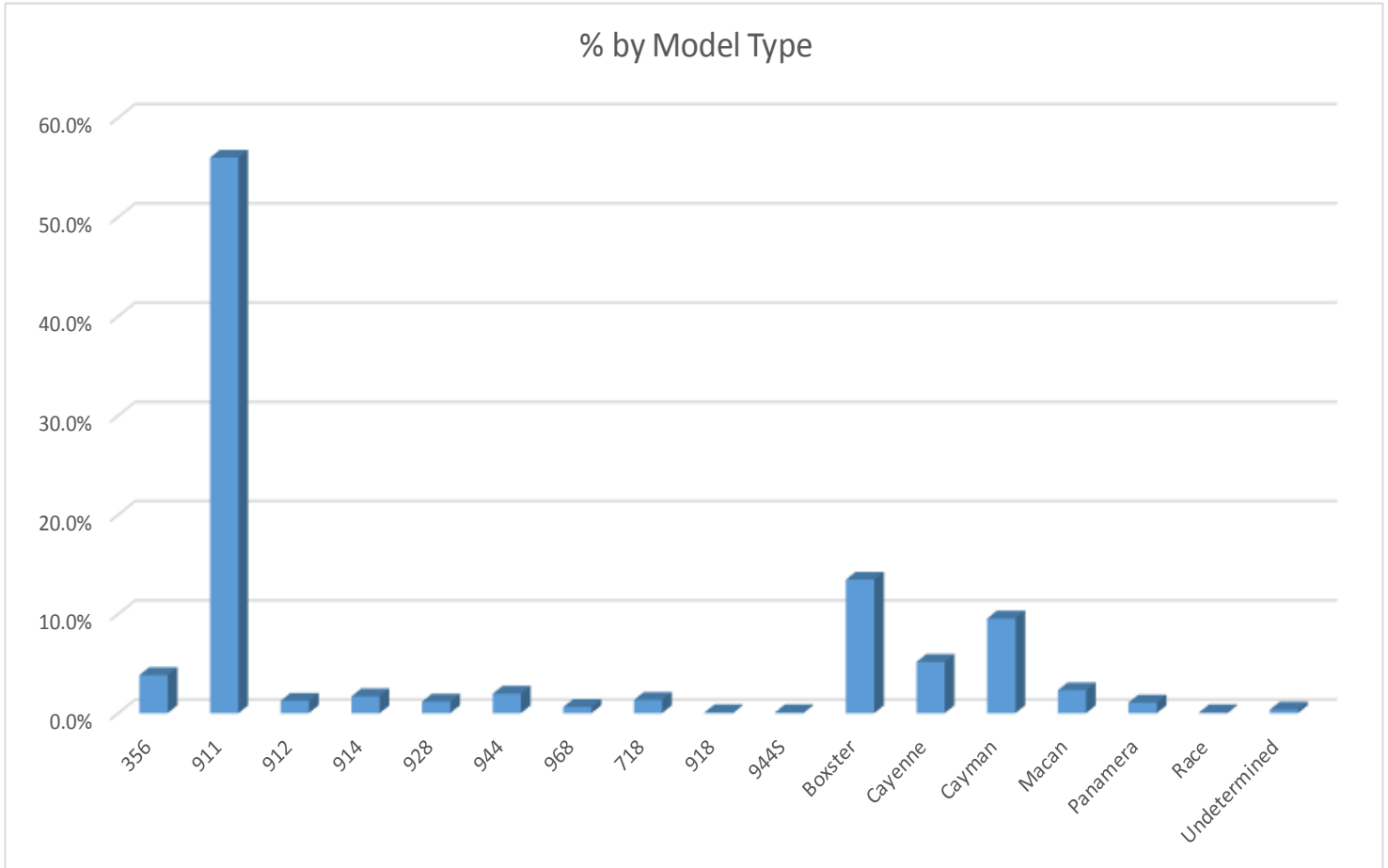
